



Park Rules and Regulations

PARK CLOSSES AT SUNSET OR 8:00 PM

All pavilion use, weddings, business or organization events must be reserved in advance.

- The use of alcoholic beverages must be preapproved and an event liability with liquor policy obtained. Over indulgence, disruptive or destructive behavior will result in being expelled from the park and having visitation privileges revoked.
- Use of marijuana and other illegal drugs is strictly prohibited anywhere on the premises.
- Please keep noise to a minimum. No loud vehicles please.
- No live music, loud speakers, or any amplified music without prior park management approval.
- No sales or solicitations on premises without prior park management approval.
- Please don't move picnic tables except in the Pavilions, and kindly return them to their original position when your event is over.
- No sprinklers, pools or bounce houses allowed without prior park management approval.
- Please use bicycles and skateboards on the roadway only.
- Please help keep the park clean by picking up your refuse and bottles, bagging your party's garbage, and disposing of it in the trash cans provided. If large trash bags are full, bring to dumpster by the exit or into large trash boxes at each pavilion.
- Visitors can drive up to the Conn (upper) and Ohmen (lower) pavilions.
- Be respectful of the premises. Do not pick the flowers or disfigure any trees, shrubs, gardens, tables, benches, buildings or fences, etc.
- No dogs or pets allowed in park without proper paperwork for service animals provided prior to the event.
- Fires must be made in equipment provided or in personally owned grill units. No open, barrel or ground fires allowed.
- Be considerate of other patrons, use great caution with children and seniors.
- Kindly park at the edge of the road when possible, not blocking the road.

Picnic areas reserved for parties will be ready by 10AM unless otherwise arranged.

All parties that have 100 people or more MUST supply a temporary restroom. Please contact the office for additional details. A fine of up to \$150.00 will be charged if the client does not comply.

This contract will not be valid unless the Covid-19 Compliance Agreement is filled out, signed, and returned.
